#### Overview

This project supported teacher salaries at two schools in Myanmar with a total of 400-450 students. The schools are located inside the troubled Thai/Burma border area near Mae Sot, Thailand. Internally displaced people and refugee families have lived along this area in camps, often for many years. After years of unrest and destruction from civil unrest and war, Karen people group families are cautiously returning to villages to start again with little or no resources to support themselves. This project has taken two years and the consolidation of the teaching staff has had a huge, impact, providing much-needed consistency with a better quality of teaching, despite the period of lockdown this year

Salary for 27 school teachers Teaching numbers remained very stable over the two-year period which is a reflection on the positive school culture being developed and the consistency of wages. The schools are expanding with additional teachers to be added.

Student numbers have also been steady over the two-year period, despite the uncertainty and few resources. Families are re-establishing themselves from scratch and education is a huge step forward bringing hope for a brighter future.
